

TECHNOLOGY INFORMATION MEETING
October 2, 2014 @ South Country Library

The meeting was called to order by Bob Johnson. On a motion from Stephen Ingram and Jason Terhune, the minutes of the last meeting were approved.

Stephen Ingram talked about “getting things done” and several applications that allow you to save information, websites, articles, etc. and have it easily accessible.

- Microsoft One Note (also has a cloud service version)
 - A stripped down MS Word online—can also paste graphics anywhere you want
 - Build pages and categories
 - Stored in the cloud, open desktop and synchronize anytime, anyplace
 - An organizational tool that integrates with Office; can be exported to Office docs
 - Offers some free storage
- Evernote
 - Free and online
- Web Clipper app
 - Clip from websites, create a notebook, manage/organize/share
 - 60mg space free each month, then resets
- Portable apps.com
 - Copy apps to flash drive, put on desktop and run from there
 - Use it then delete it

Dominic A??? demonstrated the chromebooks he now uses for patrons.

Powerwash erases all user data—makes laptops ready for next patron

Patron can sign in with their google account to bring over their apps and bookmarks

Can log in as Guest (no bookmarks), log out and all data erased

- Runs four different Android apps
- Simple, no time management, no updating

Dom also talked about Open Kiosk for Opac terminal. Can easily set blacklist or whitelist. He also showed us *Own Cloud* which is free and open source. You can mount cloud based services and link from there. It is locally installed on a server.
