New overdrive interface page - 2 biggest complaints were the way it now displays on small mobile screens, and the racy book covers that come up on the main page. Kris Minschke said that on April 1 there will a way to choose the display to be a grid or list, and that should help with the small mobile screens. Overdrive acknowledged the problem of the questionable covers and are trying to come up with a solution. Pretty soon all versions of IE will be able to work with Overdrive without the chrome plug-in.

Kris also mentioned the April 15 10 am meeting at SCLS which will be a download discussion roundtable - creating instructions that can be shared among libraries and patrons.

How to keep all staff up on technology: Best solutions were staff training, get administration on board, have devices available for staff to use.
