

The author event was SRO-over 300 people came and Gretchen Browne, the director of P-OB PL had to direct her staff to set up approximately 40 seats in the hallway. My assistant director, Ryan Athanas, and I put together a slide show of the artwork and music of the children and some adults from the concentration camp, Terezin. This played across a very large movie screen while people were filing in and after the talk. (Much of the plot of *The Lost Wife*, the 2012 LI Reads selection, takes place in Terezin during WWII.) There was a robust question-and-answer session after Ms. Richman's talk (I did the Phil Donahue mic thing-anyone remember him?) then the book signing commenced.

Loretta Piscatella arranged for a bus for the East End which was to be shared with Nassau. However, Nassau didn't need it, but we filled it! Rona Dressler (P-M) and Elva Zeichner (Riverhead) prepared a handout and led an on-board book discussion. Light snacks were provided.

The LI Reads Committee met on Wednesday morning, May 16, 2012 at Port Washington Public Library. We were told that *The Lost Wife* European Tour is a 'go'! A few spaces can be added if anyone is interested. It is \$3864 per person, including air, and tours relevant sites from the book in Prague, Budapest and Vienna. The Committee is in the process of reading ARCs and other books looking for the 2013 selection. We are also working on an 'all about LI Reads' brochure and a possible expansion of book discussions and social media presence. This year marked our first year of presenting the author with an engraved, glass 'award'. It was in the shape of a standing book and lovely.
