

Board Meeting Tuesday, September 11, 2018 SCLS- Bellport, N.Y.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

Lauren Scottaline made a motion to approve the August minutes with corrections. Nicole Berroyer and Joan Cook approved the motion.

<u>President's Report:</u> Lauren Scottaline reported that the SCLA Board will be reviewing suggestions on policies regarding our relationship with NYLA and how information is accessed and shared; policies are also being worked on for managing the Long Island Library Conference Committee. An SCLA Board Member is to be present at all future LILC meetings.

The SCLA Treasurer will create a Google Form or spreadsheet to track where donations come from, so as not to bombard the same businesses over and over again.

SSD would like to remind everyone that they will be hosting a workshop on Canva. This is taking place on Tuesday, September 25, 2018. There is a \$10 fee for non-SSD members to attend.

SSD members will be meeting with the Department of Homeland Security to discuss a continuation plan for libraries, with the goal to have an emergency operations plan in place. There is a want for libraries to be specifically addressed and to have videos made of what to do in an emergency situation in a library. Members of Homeland Security took tours of different libraries in New York State to obtain a better understanding.

The SCLA Annual Dinner will be held on Thursday, November 15th, 2018 at the Long Island Aquarium in Riverhead.

The Annual Legislative Breakfast will be held on Friday, September 21, 2018 at 8:30 a.m. at the Brentwood Public Library.

SCLA and CLASC will be offering a Librarian I Children's and Entry Level review course on Wednesday, October 10, 2018 at Sachem Public Library from 6-8 p.m. Pizza and beverages will be served. Members are free, non-members will be charged \$5.00. The exam will be held on Saturday, October 20th.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Maureen Nicolazzi reported that the opening balance was \$4,804.44. **Total revenues** from new member/continuing dues and RASD Annual Luncheon/Meeting was \$83.00. **Total expenses** from the RASD Annual Luncheon/meeting/ speaker was \$300.00. The **closing balance** as of September 10, 2018 is \$4,587.44.

<u>Electronic Resources:</u> Dave Jones reported that the next meeting is on Wednesday, December 19th at SCLS. 9:30 a.m. coffee, 10:00 a.m. meeting. The committee is building on the lessons learned at the September "Tactics for Increasing Privacy and Security" meeting and there will be a round table discussion on how Suffolk County libraries provide digital literacy training either online or in person. Furthermore, the committee will consider whether one-on-one or classroom style settings are most effective.

A representative from SCLS will speak about their new upcoming digital training platform using Moodle along with other librarians discussing how they effectively teach digital literacy. Dave is speaking with Jim Wilson of Niche Academy on giving a demonstration of using their resources to provide online tutorials. More information will be available shortly.

<u>Health Concerns</u>: Sal Filosa reported that Sara Fade will be joining the committee as the new Co-Chair- welcome, Sara!

The case study for the Journal of the Medical Library Association was accepted pending revisions. Sal and colleagues from Stony Brook Health Sciences Library are in the final stages of the editing process and will re-submit at the end of next week. The speaker for the breakfast in November will be Sandeep K. Mallipattu, MD, Chief of the Division of Nephrology and Hypertension at Stony Brook University School of Medicine. The breakfast will begin at 9:00 a.m., RASD meeting at 9:30 a.m., and his presentation at 10:00 a.m. Dr. Mallipattu will discuss the topic of the disease and prevention, then after a short break will discuss what happens once you're diagnosed with kidney disease.

The committee is currently discussing options for a raffle prize. Fliers and infographics for the breakfast will be out soon.

She has emailed Lauren Scottaline an updated list of sign-ups and she will follow up with the presenter from the Elizabeth A. Morton Foundation to see if they need anything specific for the presentation. As of September 10, 2018, there were 25 people signed up to attend. Laurel stated that she received more raffle donations from vendors and collected a healthy sum for donations. Lauren Scottaline made a motion to approve funding up to \$200 for raffles and donations. Wonda Miller and Jo-Ann Carhart approved. Nicole Berroyer seconded the motion.

<u>Membership:</u> Jessicca Newmark reported that there are 199 members to date which is up from 193 from last month.

M.O.S.A.I.C.: Amber Gagliardi reported that the next committee meeting will be on Tuesday, September 18th at SCLS. The presentation would not be the same as the one from the breakfast, however it would be a similar topic about patron privacy and libraries as safe places. She encourages all committees to devise topics for the conference sooner rather than later because the deadline is usually in December.
