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Job Description

Academic librarians are involved in a wide range of services: reference, technical, circulation, interlibrary loan, periodical; instructional material, special library (business, medical, museums, rare book, music) and administration.

They work directly serving the college community, as well as behind the scenes, cultivating and organizing the library's collections, programs, and services.

Academic librarians assist the faculty, students and the administrative staff in finding information and using it effectively. They must have knowledge of a wide variety of scholarly and general information sources.

Academic librarians follow technologies closely. They select and organize library materials. They manage staff, and develop and direct bibliographic instruction programs designed to meet specific needs of faculty and students.

Education Requirements

A master's degree in Library Science (MLS) from an American Library Association accredited library school. Usually a second subject master's degree is required. Scholarly publications may also be required for promotion and tenure.

Academic librarians are not required to have Civil Service registration nor do they have to be on Civil Service lists.
