SEE FOR YOURSELF 2014: AN ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY AND RESOURCE FAIR FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE BLIND OR VISUALLY IMPAIRED

On Saturday, May 17, 2014 (10:00am - 4:00pm) the Outreach Services Department of the Suffolk Cooperative Library System (SCLS) will host *SEE FOR YOURSELF 2014*. This event is designed to focus on organizations, resources, services and the most current low-tech and hi-tech devices for people living with vision loss. SCLS Outreach Services has been hosting this event since 1994. Our previous fair, *SEE FOR YOURSELF 2012* attracted approximately 400 attendees. We hope that this year's event will be even more successful, as it is the first time the event will be held on a weekend.

As you know, this event is also a library event, a place where library administration and staff can come to learn about the technologies that should be available to their residents who are learning disabled, visually impaired or blind. Many of the devices, software and hardware can enable patrons to participate in all that their library has to offer, once the library has programs, services and technologies that make it accessible to everyone in the community.

Over the next few months we will be sending information to all of the public libraries on Long Island, as well as local organizations, service providers and county agencies. We hope that you will make the SEE FOR YOURSELF 2014 information available to your patrons and colleagues.
