 - Computer & Digital Services
 - Inspiration Bar
 - Walk ins: service hours per day
 - Covers cell phones, e-Books, anything?
 - Periodic classes for patrons & staff
 - 1 on 1 lessons by appointment (1/2 – 1 hour)
 - Can get specific problems so tech can do research beforehand
 - 1 on 1 lessons – walk ins “Tech 30”
 - Online forums
 - Homework for motivation and follow-up appointments
 - Handouts with PW sheet on back
- Staff Allocation for Patron computer services
 - Combination of techs, librarians, computer pages, High School/College volunteers, senior volunteers, Reference Librarians on library services
 - Location? Computer lab, other?
 - Use some of the time to sell library services
- WiFi for the Public
 - Northport more than doubled usage after upgrading wireless service
 - Time limit on WiFi login?
 - Create classes based on what devices and apps being used (data collection)
 - How to track data...Google Analytics, wifistats.com (\$125/yr)
- How to move forward with latest tsunami of devices coming into the library
 - Strategy: Tech Help, Round Table
 - PR: local newspapers, newsletter, social media
 - Educate, not repair (liability waiver)
 - Staffing and time periods
 - Offer combination of appointment and walk in help

- Nexus 7-- Google tablets from NYS
 - Uses:
 - Teen programs when more teens than computers
 - In Children's Room but pay for apps with no ads
 - Use for newsstand apps (Zinio, Freegal)
 - ESOL, Mango, etc.
 - Tablet classes
 - Circulate for a longer period of time
 - Use as eBooks with Nook app
 - App experience
 - Cons:
 - Patrons more interested in iPads
 - Batteries constantly draining
 - After circulating, must clean and restore
 - Time consuming to set up, maintain, etc.
