- Visit local pools or beaches; bring a prize wheel, trivia, paperback books, bookmarks, leftover summer reading club prizes, and 3-D printed items.
- Have a rolling bag ready and stocked with fliers and other items you plan to bring.
- Show outdoor films and hold outdoor concerts.
- Visit at farmers' markets.
- Always have your library services brochure available to hand out.
- Have a library mascot or person in a literary character costume at events.
- Use a prize wheel.
- Borrow items from SCLS for outreach; tent, generator, coolers, mobile Wi-Fi, trailer, prize wheel, popcorn machine, or outdoor movie screen.
- Attend town festivals and events.
