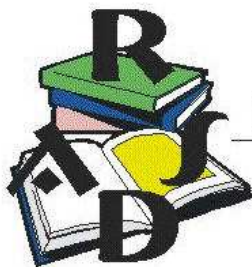

At Stony Brook, Dr. Pameijer works with a multidisciplinary team of renowned specialists. Dr. Pameijer completed a fellowship in surgical oncology at the City of Hope National Medical Center, Duarte, California, a National Cancer Institute-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center.

Our second speaker is Dr. Victoria Siegel, a professor at SCCC, who trains student nurses on skin cancer and has done extensive research on the subject.

Prior to the workshop we will have a delicious breakfast followed by a short RASD meeting. At 10am, our presentation will begin.
