Organized by Sue Alman, a lecturer at San Jose State University School of Information, the event's keynote speaker was Jason Griffey, Fellow at the Berkman Klein Center for Internet & Society at Harvard University. Topics included "Security in Libraries: A Case for Blockchain Technology," "Applying Blockchain to the Information Professions," "Blockchain Technology for Recordkeeping," and "Setting Up a Blockchain for the Public Library."
