What is the purpose of the SLEOA Award?

The Suffolk Library Excellence in Outreach Award recognizes the achievements of a public or academic library that has made outstanding contributions to the development, promotion, and implementation of outreach services in the local community.

Who is eligible?

Any public or academic library staff may submit an application on behalf of a public or academic library, in Suffolk County, describing outreach endeavors between October 1, 2022 and October 1, 2023. Applications must be submitted by active members of the Suffolk Library Association.
