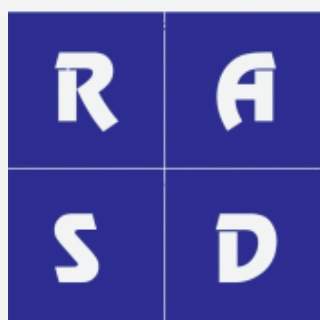

Readers' Advisory

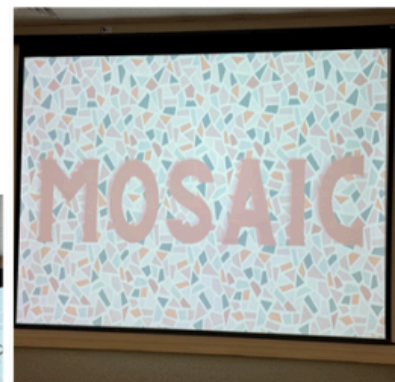
