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Job Description

A school library media specialist is both a teacher and a librarian in K-12 schools. The classroom of the school librarian is the school library.

School librarians perform five roles in schools:

- Teachers of information literacy/ inquiry and technology skills
- 2. Information specialists
- 3. Instructional partners with other classroom teachers
- 4. Program administrators of the library program and facility in their schools
- Leaders in building 21st century skills throughout the school environment.

Education Requirements

A master's degree in Library Science (MLS) is necessary for librarian positions in all public and private school libraries.

In addition to the MLS, New York State Education Law and the Commissioner's Regulations require prospective New York State teachers to pass designated tests and attend mandated workshops and seminars.
