Job Description

Special librarians, often referred to as information professionals, work for organizations that have a specific subject focus. Organizations with related special libraries include hospitals, corporate entities, government agencies, and nonprofit agencies. Some special libraries, such as the National Library of Medicine, may be public, while others, such as the Folger Shakespeare Library, are private. Often, special libraries exist as an entity within a larger organization such as a university.

The primary responsibility of the special librarian is to fulfill the information needs of members of the organization. Special librarians collect materials relevant to the subject area and organize them, provide reference service for members of the organization or other constituents, and may participate in digital projects. Special librarians follow trends related to their subject specialty closely. In larger libraries, they may manage staff, or develop initiatives to support research and scholarship.

Education Requirements

A master's degree in Library Science (MLS) from an American Library Association-accredited library school.

Some special libraries may require an additional master's degree or doctorate in a relevant field. A law librarian may be required to have a law degree.

Special librarians are not required to have Civil Service registration nor do they have to be on Civil Service lists.
