Job Description

Public Librarians work in a wide range of departments in libraries: Reference and Adult Services, Children's Services, Technical Services, Computer Services, and Administration.

They work directly serving the public, as well as behind the scenes, cultivating and organizing the library's collections, programs, and services.

Public Librarians assist people of all ages in finding information. They also show patrons how to use that information effectively. They must have knowledge of a wide variety of resources in a multitude of fields.

Librarians follow trends closely related to publishing, computers, and other services. They manage staff, assist patrons with information resources and technology, and develop and conduct programs for the public.

Education Requirements

A master's degree in Library Science (MLS) is necessary for librarian positions in most public libraries. The majority of libraries require librarians to take specific Civil Service exams, such as the Entry Level Librarian or the Children's Librarian exams.

In addition, librarians need to acquire a Public Librarian Certificate from the New York State Education Department upon graduation.

Librarians who receive their degree after January 1, 2010 need to attend 60 hours of continuing professional development every five years in order to renew their Public Librarian Certificate. For more information, visit: http://www.nysl.nysed.gov/libdev/cert/conted.htm
