President's Message

We hope that everyone is having a wonderful summer!

We are excited to be getting ready for fall which includes our SCLA Annual Dinner, to be held at the Long Island Aquarium on November 15th. Fall also brings the Annual NYLA Conference which will take place in Rochester from November 7-10th. I hope that our members come out to participate in these opportunities for professional development and networking. Additionally, fall is the time for civil service examinations and I wanted to thank the Suffolk County Department of Civil Service staff for reviewing procedures with SCLA regarding examination reviews. Many people will take advantage of the opportunity to attend the review that takes place one week following the exam, where challenging questions is presented. However, many test takers do not take advantage of the computational review of an exam; which is offered after you receive your score. Information regarding the computational review for any exam that you take will be included in the letter that you receive that contains your score. Civil Service staff wanted SCLA to remind all members that this review is available for all exams and will allow you to see areas that you may be deficient in, which will help to improve future scores. Please keep this in mind for the fall 2018 examinations.

Recently, Forbes magazine published an opinion piece by economics professor, Panos Mourdoukoutas, stating that libraries are outdated and that Amazon book shops should pop up and "save taxpayer money." As I scrolled through my Facebook newsfeed and found this article, I was immediately outraged and began to share and comment to show my annoyance and hopefully get the word out that this couldn't be more false. Libraries are not just repositories for books. We aren't book shops. We are community centers for lifelong learning. Would these "pop-up shops" offer any of the services that libraries do such as; **free museum passes, free summer lunch programs, early childhood development support and programs, outdoor spaces, community movies and concerts, services to the homebound, free online digital services, senior connections, courses for citizenship and English language learning, career counseling, homework help....?** The list of library services that could never be replicated by a pop-up shop rolled through my head so quickly that I couldn't even attempt to write them all down. As I continued to scroll through my Facebook newsfeed, hoping to see a picture of a cute baby or puppy in order to calm me down, I was bombarded by the social media posts of colleagues and libraries posting about events, services and the pure joy of the job. I saw pictures of a sensory program where children were touching and painting with different types of vegetables. It was a joyous mess of fun! I saw pictures from an outdoor movie at a library with hundreds of people in attendance. I saw announcements of new spaces and services opening at libraries throughout the County. Irrelevant, you say? Impossible, I say.

I know I speak for all of us when I say that we realize this is only one man's opinion and that he clearly doesn't know the breadth of services offered at public libraries. BUT... I also realized that this is a well-educated member of society and yet he clearly doesn't know all that we have to offer because if he did, he would feel so very differently.

So my challenge to myself and my challenge to you is to be an **ADVOCATE**. Everywhere you go...talk to someone about libraries. Continue to educate the community about the services that we offer and remind the masses that the **LIBRARY IS FOR EVERYONE!**
