

We held our annual Fran Romer Memorial Booktalk Workshop on March 31, 2022. This year we were joined by Eric Smith, author of Don't Read the Comments



This program provides historical societies and museums an opportunity to improve access to archival collections. LILRC Project Archivist, Robert Anen, assists member institutions in providing archival services such as processing and housing a collection or defined body of materials. Member historical societies, museums, and libraries can apply for the services of the project archivist. Priority will be given to those institutions that have a well defined project which can generally be completed within a two month period.
