If you would like to subscribe you must join SCLA. Click here to join SCLA. Starting January 1, 2023 new membership pricing will come into effect and will be on a year to year basis.

For those who have access to the SCLA listserv, we ask that you abide by the following rules:

- \* Please do not post personal messages.
- \* Only use the REPLY command if you want to respond to the whole list.
- \* Be considerate. When you are posting a message, remember that there is a person behind every email address. There is zero tolerance for spam emails pushing a specific agenda, political or otherwise, or promoting any type of organization irrelevant to Suffolk County libraries.
- \* Unethical behavior by any member can lead to temporary or permanent removal from accessing and posting to the listserv. Such decision may only be made by the SCLA Executive Board.


