DASL will host THE HUMAN LIBRARY: Promoting Diversity and Dialog in Your Library at the Long Island Library Conference in May.

DASL president Bruce Seger commented, "We are excited not only to be sponsoring this important and exciting diversity concept, but also to have two wonderful and dynamic speakers from SUNY Stony Brook Academic Libraries, Christ Kretz, and Sunny Chung."

The Human Library is an internationally recognized learning experience featuring people as "Open Books" discussing specific prejudices or stereotypes they have overcome. In an increasingly divided world, the Human Library is an opportunity to promote dialogue through personal conversations among diverse people, inviting the audience as "readers" to "unjudge someone." The presentation will include the concept of the Human Library, the logistics of applying for and licensing the event, recruiting of Books, managing marketing, running the event, and assessment activities. Along the way we can talk about building partnerships outside the library, training volunteers, and the overall "lessons learned."

The Division of Academic and Special Libraries (DASL) held its annual luncheon at Carnival Restaurant in Port Jefferson. The special guest speaker was Danielle Gruttadaurio, the only Forensic Artist for the Suffolk Police Department. Danielle helps victims identify criminals by sketching their faces for identification. She also sketches faces from skulls found at crime scenes and has been an integral part of some of the major crimes scene on television. DASL president Bruce Seger commented that Ms. Gruttadaurio shared a wealth of knowledge, demonstrated her skills with examples of her criminal sketches, and explained the intricacies of her job including assisting victims recall their horrific criminal encounters for identification. She is a former art teacher and crime victim which she believes helps her relate to other victims to help identify their attackers. Everyone came away wowed with the presentation and were interested in potential future presentations by this unique forensic artist.

The 2023 pick is...Better Living Through Birding by Christian Cooper. Cooper tells the story of his extraordinary life leading up to the nowinfamous incident in Central Park one morning in May 2020 when what might have been a routine encounter with a dog walker exploded age-old racial tensions. Cooper shows how a life spent looking up at the birds prepared him, in the most uncanny of ways, to be a gay, Black man in America today.

Long Island Reads will honor Christian Cooper in person and online at an award ceremony on April 21, 2024 at the Plainview-Old Bethpage Public Library.
